

Transport Accident Commission



The primary role of the Transport Accident Commission (TAC) is to fund services for people injured in transport crashes.

In the last financial year, TAC funded \$709 million to more than 39,000 people.

Each year TAC receives around six new claims from people who have had a limb amputated as a result of a transport accident. TAC is currently assisting 90 clients with amputations.

TAC provides care and compensation on a no-fault basis to these people, in some cases for life.

Support services that TAC may fund include:

- Income support for people whose injuries prevent them from performing their normal job duties
- Rehabilitation and disability services
- Return to work programs
- Travel costs for transport to and from medical appointments and treatment sessions
- Home services if a person cannot perform the household tasks they did before the accident because of their injuries
- Equipment aids such as

wheelchairs or crutches that
are recommended by a health
care professional

- Lump sum and weekly payments
for permanent impairments

TAC also invests significantly in accident prevention through public education campaigns and road infrastructure projects to reduce the impact of road trauma on the Victorian community.
